<u>CWID Data Note: Cumulative College Credits and</u> <u>Reverse Transfer Eligibility</u>

This <u>CWID</u> Data Note written by Matt S. Giani and Jason L. Taylor, is the first in a series that will draw upon student-level data collected by the <u>Office of Community College</u> <u>Research and Leadership (OCCRL)</u> to answer key questions of interest to the <u>CWID</u> community related to reverse transfer and transfer more broadly. The purpose of the Data Note Series is to report emerging results from the CWID initiative and to inform ongoing policy development and implementation for states adopting reverse transfer policies. The Data Note series will begin by answering policy-relevant questions using the <u>CWID</u> <u>Baseline Study</u> Dataset, which utilizes data from a single cohort of students who transferred to a university in a <u>CWID state</u> in Fall 2008 and tracks the university persistence and degree completion outcomes for these students through Spring 2012...
