Pair and Share Pathways to Results regional workshop

The Office of Community College Research and Leadership and the Illinois Center for Specialized Professional Support (ICSPS) will be hosting the Pair and Share Pathways to Results workshop which will be held at Harper College in Palatine, IL on Tuesday, November 18, 2014. The purpose of the workshop is to allow individuals and teams that are currently engaging in or have completed a PTR project to interact and learn of new PTR related information. The workshop will consist of a brief overview of PTR, introduction of new processes and tools (evaluation and benchmarking, curriculum evaluation, advanced ways to measure equity gaps, and mapping pathways), and time for PTR users to share about their projects and experiences. We strongly encourage participants that have used the PTR process to bring someone along with them to the workshop that has not used the PTR process before. There is no cost for the workshop, however individuals must [register](#) to participate.
