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# Overview

Pathways to Results (PTR) is an outcomes-focused, equity-guided process to improve programs and policies that support student transition to and through postsecondary education into employment. PTR focuses on addressing equity gaps between diverse learner groups and continuously improving processes critical to student success, including retention, completion of postsecondary credentials, and transition to employment. PTR emerged as a method to improve programs of study in the state of Illinois, and it is being scaled to other states through the Trade Adjustment Act College and Career Training (TAACCCT) grant program.

#### Goals

- Develop and refine programs of study and supporting processes to improve the career pathways that lead students to employment.
- Develop and implement an inquiry-based, equity-guided process to improve programs and enhance access and equitable outcomes for diverse learners.
- Improve transition outcomes for underserved students, including groups of students who are racially and ethnically diverse, low income, low literacy, and first-generation college.
- Improve access of local teams to data and tools to support continuous improvement and student outcomes.
